**Jared Sexton** is Professor and Former Chair of African American Studies at the University of California, Irvine. He has published articles in venues like *African American Review*, *Artforum*, *Callaloo*, *Cultural Critique*, *Harpers*, *Social Text*, and *Radical History Review*, and contributed chapters to various anthologies on contemporary popular and political culture. His books include "Amalgamation Schemes: Antiracialism and the Critique of Multiracialism," "Black Masculinity and the Cinema of Policing", and, most recently, "Black Men, Black Feminism: Lucifer's Nocturne." Professor Sexton has also pursued research as a President's Postdoctoral Fellow at UC Berkeley, a Scholar-in-Residence at the Interdisciplinary Humanities Center at UC Santa Barbara, a Fulbright Distinguished Chair at the Centre for Feminist Research at York University in Toronto and, in the coming year, a Beinecke Fellow at the Clark Art Institute.



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
