Lawrence Venuti is Professor of English at Temple University. He works in early modern literature, anglophone and foreign-language poetic traditions, translation theory and history, and literary translation. He is the author of *Our Halcyon Dayes: English Prerevolutionary Texts and Postmodern Culture* (1989), *The Translator's Invisibility: A History of Translation* (1994; 2nd ed., 2008), *The Scandals of Translation: Towards an Ethics of Difference* (1998), and *Translation Changes Everything: Theory and Practice* (2012). He is the editor of the anthology of essays, *Rethinking Translation: Discourse*, *Subjectivity, Ideology* (1992), and of *The Translation Studies Reader* (2000; 3rd ed., 2012), a survey of translation theory from antiquity to the present.
